



Racing NEWS #2 August 2018

History – During the second season of Carrick Speedway in 1969/70, 18 race meetings were held. This would have been a huge effort by those involved. The track was being run by the Carrick Speedway Drivers Club with President, Geoff Stagg, in charge. The club was growing at an enormous rate with over 100 members now officially on board.

On the 7th December, 1969 – corner steward and Carrick Speedway Drivers Club Public Officer George Lockwood was hit by a car and thrown 10ft into the air. He was taken to hospital but did recover from his injuries. This is a good reason not to have infield crew close to the edge of the track!

During this season Ross Davey found out quickly what happens when you have a disagreement with an official. 5th April, 1970 - Lionel Rose attended the speedway. He sang a few tunes including his hit "I thank you".



Ress Davey, licence helder number 32 is suspended from ra cing for a period of Six menths, from December 7,1969 until June 6,1970, for

- (1) Deliberately ramming Car 61 into the pit gates after the conclusion of the last race at Carrick Speedway on December 7,1969, and
- (2) Fighting with a Steward, being an appointed Official.

He was not conducting himself in a manner beneficial to Speedway, and displayed to a despertamental speedway.

This decision was made on December 7.1969 by the undersigned.

Survey Concerns Discussed

Smoking – the issue of smoking on the banks has caused a problem since the government implemented the regulations. These are not Carrick Speedway rules but Tasmanian Government Legislation that we are required, as a facility who has the public enter, to enforce the legislation.



As the signage states, there is no smoking within 20 metres of the competition area which in our case is the track and also within 20 metres of seating area - spectators. That means all smokers need to move off the spectator banks and smoke in the designated smoking areas. Using the buckets to dispose of cigarette butts would be fantastic too but there will always be some who choose not agree and make it hard for everyone else.

Whilst security attempt to help with smoking on the banks, as soon as security is gone, the smoker lights up again. If you see Carrick Speedway personnel around the banks, please advise them of any smoking on the banks and we will try our utmost to address the issue. If you have a practical solution to this issue, we would love for you to get in touch.

Chairs in grandstands – This has also caused many comments, not only in the survey but also during the season at race meetings. Those using the grandstands were asked numerous times during the season not to use chairs but again many choose to ignore the request. This season, there will be new signage implemented and Carrick Management will attempt to combat the issue.

What the flags mean?

During a race meeting, stewards wave a variety of flags at drivers.

Below is a list of what is used

	GREEN LIGHT and FLAG Start, or restart of Event, or Event is in progress
	YELLOW LIGHT and FLAG Caution - hold position at reduced safe speed
>	CROSSED YELLOW and GREEN FLAGS Field to form up for a start or a complete restart
	RED LIGHT and FLAG Stop immediately and do not go past accident scene or cut across Infield - while exercising due caution
	BLACK FLAG with WHITE DIAGONAL STRIPE Warning - due to rule infringement. Driver is subject to enquiry from Chief Steward and may be penalised for infringement(s)
	BLACK FLAG Disqualification - Driver to withdraw from Event using caution whilst doing so
